Dance Studies Association Early Dance Working Group

2019 Meeting Minutes

Overview

Eleven members attended the working group meeting, which was held at the Orrington Hotel in Evanston, IL, on August 8. Discussion was lively and productive. Everyone was pleased with the energy and enthusiasm the working group has generated since its revival in 2017 and relieved that dance history and historical dance did not disappear entirely when CORD and SDHS merged to form DSA, as many feared. We also accomplished a lot since our last meeting (see below), including making our Resources website ever more useful. (And Emily is always eager to receive your additions, corrections, and suggestions for the website.)

Nevertheless, historical methods, perspectives, and dance forms still feel marginal and tangential at the DSA and in dance studies more generally. The group discussed diverse strategies for increasing visibility and participation, and for helping our dance colleagues see that our work connects in so many ways with theirs. (See below for details.) However, this is an ongoing discussion, and more input and ideas are needed.

One of the directions the discussion took was to consider our group's name, "Early Dance," and to ask whether a new name might be more inclusive and less marginalizing. New name suggestions included "Dance in Deep Time" and "History/Memory/Practice." What are your thoughts and suggestions? Along those same lines, we talked about updating our mission statement. (See below for our current goals and a link to the current description on the DSA website.) Your feedback is warmly welcomed!

We are also excited about two new initiatives to facilitate and extend working group discussions beyond the annual meeting: 1) In between meetings, we will collectively read and discuss an article of general interest to early dance scholars, and 2) we will test new virtual discussion formats for organizing conference panels, asking and responding to research questions, and otherwise making it easier to share and benefit from our collective wisdom and experience.

Finally, the next DSA conference will be in Vancouver, October 15-18, 2020, and the 2021 DSA will be in New Jersey, October 14-17, 2021. Stay tuned!
